

## 2019 PASA STUDENT SCORE REPORT

## Performance Levels and Profile

Your child receives a score based upon the number of items answered correctly on the first attempt. Students may also have a second opportunity to answer the item by receiving a second prompt. The number of items the student is able to answer correctly with the second prompt provides teachers and parents with important information about performance. Each subject area score is translated into an overall performance level of Advanced, Proficient, Novice or Emerging.

Advanced: Using their primary mode of communication, appropriate supports and accommodations, the Advanced student demonstrates a consistent academic awareness and excellent understanding of the knowledge, skills and processes as outlined by the Pennsylvania Alternate Eligible Content and tier designation.
Proficient: Using their primary mode of communication, appropriate supports and accommodations, the Proficient student demonstrates an essential academic awareness and satisfactory understanding of the knowledge, skills and processes as outlined by the Pennsylvania Alternate Eligible Content and tier designation.

Novice: Using their primary mode of communication, appropriate supports and accommodations, the Novice student demonstrates an improving academic awareness and partial understanding of the knowledge, skills and processes as outlined by the Pennsylvania Alternate Eligible Content and tier designation.

Emerging: Using their primary mode of communication, appropriate supports and accommodations, the Emerging student demonstrates a preliminary academic awareness and limited understanding of the knowledge, skills and processes as outlined by the Pennsylvania Alternate Eligible Content and tier designation.

What does each Performance Level mean? Here you will find a description of each performance level.

Your Student's Performance Profile: Here you will find the total number of items your student got correct on each test, including the writing portion of the ELA test.

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Performance Levels and Scaled Score
A scaled score shows your child's score on the PASA that is standard for all students taking the alternate assessment. Scaled scores for PASA range from 200 to 600 across both tiers of the assessment for each subject area. The tables below show how your child performed in each subject area and the average score for students who participated in the same test.

Your student's score is indicated by the ( $\mathbf{(})$. The average score of all students who took this test in 2018-2019 was 528 . Test scores are an estimate of your child's performance. If your student were to take the test again under similar circumstances, his or her scale score would most likely stay in the following range: 520-536.


Your student's score is indicated by the ( $\mathbf{T}$ ). The average score of all students who took this test in 2018-2019 was 298 . Test scores are an estimate of your child's performance. If your student were to take the test again under similar circumstances, his or her scale score would most likely stay in the following range: 274-312.

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Your Student's Tier: Here you will find the tier test your student took for each content area.

Your Student's Scale Score: Here you will find your student's scale score for each content area.

Average Score and Standard Error of Measurement: Here you will find the average scale score for all students taking this same test as well as the standard error of measurement. The standard error of measurement tells you the range of scores in which your student's score would fall if they were to take a different version of the test.
